KCHS Marching Eagles

This year the Kent City High School Marching Band presented their marching show based on the 1950's sitcom "I Love Lucy". This show not only used the iconic I Love Lucy Theme but it used other music to help remember some of the most famous moments from the show.

Ricky, Lucy, and Ethel are portrayed by Yael Jaramillo, Elizabeth Afton and Addison Korcal. Soloists in the show are Alto Sax - Rosamaria Hernandez, Flute - Alisah Koetje, and Vocal Solo - Yael Jaramillo. Led by drum majors Alisah Koetje and Aaron Schnicke, the band has had a great season. They kicked off their season winning Grand Champion at the Kent City Invitational. Next up for the band was a hard fought second place at the Sparta Invitational. The band had one other regular season contest scheduled but it was rained out.

The band competed at State Championships Prelims in Okemos on October 26 and earned the 4th place nod moving into State Championships at Ford Field on November 2 where they took 4th place. The competition was tight this year as the top four bands are all outstanding groups. The band has had great success in the past several seasons. They were silver medalists last season and were State Champions the previous three years.

PowerSchool Parent Portal

KCHS will again be using Xello, a college and career tool which allows students to explore various pathways beyond high school. Every student has access to their account via their Chromebook. Here, students can take interest inventories, explore path-



ways, research educational institutions and scholarship resources. There are also activities students can use like a resume builder and a portfolio builder. This year, all juniors created a resume in English 11 using Xello. Additional career related activities and lessons will be created by the counseling department and incorporated into Xello throughout the school year.

Eagle Coins

Students and staff at Kent City High School are using an online program called CritterCoin to provide currency ("Eagle Coins") to students when they display positive behaviors in the school building. Students are then able to use their Eagles Coins to make purchases from the school store that is open on selected Fridays. The system has proven to be a very effective way of acknowledging when students are meeting the expectations that are set in multiple settings throughout the building.





These efforts are all part of the Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) and Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) system being implemented district wide. The acronym being used in K-12 as a reminder of what is expected from students is "G.R.E.A.T." and the graphic shown above outlines what each of the letters stands for.

End of 1st Semester / Semester Exams

The first semester at KCHS will end on December 20. This is earlier than in past years when students would return after Christmas Break and still have a couple weeks remaining in the first semester. Another change for the 24 - 25 school year is that students will once again be taking Semester Exams. High School students will take an exam in each of their classes and the exam grade will count for 15% of their overall semester grade in each course.

End of year Field Trips

Middle School students will once again have the opportunity to attend our end of the year field trips. 6th graders will be attending camp for the day. 7th graders will travel to Chicago to visit the Lincoln Park Zoo and the Museum of Science and Industry. 8th graders will visit Mackinac Island. The cost for the 6th grade trip will be \$50 and the 7th & 8th grade trips will be \$100. More information will be sent home via email at a later date.

Boaters Safety

8th graders earned their boater's safety license in October during their Trimester Exploratory PE course. Kent County Sheriff's deputies taught the course that culminated with the boater's safety test. Each 8th grader will take this course throughout the year as they rotate through exploratory courses.

NWEA MAP Testing

All Middle School students started the year with the NWEA MAP test which tests the areas of Math and English Language Arts. This continues the data collection that began at the Elementary and now continues into High School. Teachers use this data to track students progress and will work through trends to inform curriculum planning.

Griffins Game

Each Middle School grade level that maintains at least a 90% attendance rate in the month of October will earn a ticket to the daytime Grand Rapids Griffins game on Wednesday, November 13. Lunch will be provided by KCCS Food Service and tickets will be purchased by the Kent City PTCO and Kent City Community Schools. Prior to the game, students will have the opportunity to interact with booths around the stadium focused on STEM and Health & Wellness. Before departing the Middle School, each class will work through Griffin's related lessons with real-life applications.

Celebrating Walk-a-Thon GREATness

The KCE Walkathon is one of the most highly anticipated events of the year, and what a perfect day we had for our 8th annual event! On the morning of September 25th, students of all grades enjoyed participating in a variety of activities that included walking, games, dancing, music, movement and most of all.... PURE FUN!!

This year a portion of the proceeds will be used to help enhance and update the KCE Art Room. Additional proceeds will help fund academic and social experiences for our students and support our classrooms.



Words cannot express how much we appreciate your generosity and support. We look forward to continuing this tradition for years to come!






Every Day Counts!










Honoring Miss Mel
