



Spring Field Trips

6th Grade - Mr. Harding took his students to Legends Ranch in Bitely to learn about conservation and ecosystems.

7th Grade - Mrs. Lafferty will be taking 7th grade students to John Ball Zoo to learn about the ecosystem and sustainable farming/agriculture. They will also learn about both positive and negative human impact on the world. We go to John Ball Zoo to learn about the local, national and international conservation initiatives that JBZ is working on. Students are able to get hands-on experience and observations as to what is happening right here in West Michigan!

8th Grade - Mrs. Lafferty took 8th graders on a trip to learn about Space and Physics. We traveled to the Grand Rapids Public Museum where they got to see the Planetarium which shows them all of the topics they learn about with our space unit. Students also got to partake in an engineering/robotics class in which they got to build a working robot. This hands-on experience helps to bring science to life and enhances their knowledgeable connections as they continue to learn and explore the world around them.

May 30th - End of the Year Trips

6th graders will be heading to Camp Pinewood to explore outdoors, work through team-building activities, and have fun together!

7th graders are taking a trip to Chicago. They will be spending time at the Museum of Science and Industry and the Lincoln Park Zoo.

8th graders will be ferrying to Mackinac Island where they'll experience the island through a carriage ride and get to explore downtown.

High School Helpers: Fostering Fun, Friendship, and Fair Play at Recess!

Elementary students LOVE when high school students come to visit KCE, whether to read, volunteer, work or play. This spring, we have partnered with the high school to have 12 junior and senior student mentors assist with 4th grade recess! These students were given guidelines to help with social emotional learning, such as promoting good sportsmanship, serving as positive role models, and nurturing peer interactions–all while having fun! It's a win-win for both age groups by fostering leadership skills, building trust and relationships, and strengthening school culture. Currently, this program is focused on one grade level, but we are exploring opportunities to expand it and continue this initiative next year. We are grateful for our partnership with the high school to have these students here sharing their knowledge and enthusiasm with our young learners!

Growing Opportunities at KCE

Our after school clubs continue to grow! This spring, STEM teachers Nicole Andreas and Billie Freeland are hosting two fantastic learning opportunities! Back by popular demand is our KCE Coding & Robotics club for interested 3rd & 4th graders, where students will learn basic computer/programming and how to apply coding to various types of robotics. The second is a brand new drone class, where interested 5th grade students will learn about the parts of a drone, maintenance, safety, flying and potential career opportunities. Due to limited space, spots were filled on a first come, first served basis. We are so excited to provide these opportunities for students to explore, create and learn new skills outside of the regular school day.

Students Explore a Career in Teaching

Students are often asked what they want to be when they grow up, and one of their choices might be a teacher. But how will they know if this career is the right fit? Students at Kent City High School have a wonderful opportunity to explore this profession through the Teacher Academy program at Kent Career Technical Center (KCTC) which includes real-life hands-on training in classrooms right here at KCE.

A large component of this 2-year program is pairing the 11th and 12th grade students with experienced mentor teachers. Students work alongside their mentors to learn about lesson planning, classroom management and different ways students learn. Students also have the opportunity to experience different grade levels, settings and subjects in hopes of helping them decide a direction they would like to go in the teaching field. In addition, students receive weekly performance reviews from their mentor teachers and are observed 2-3 times by their KCTC instructors to make sure they're fulfilling the competencies/ guidelines set forth by the program.

Kindergarten teacher Heather Carlson stated, "What I've noticed between Year 1 and Year 2 students is a jump in confidence; Kimmy (Duran) is much more willing to do things on her own, try new things, etc.

This experience has been so valuable for these students and has provided an excellent foundation for their future endeavors. Senior Brenna Mortensen stated, "This has been the best decision I have made for myself. It has really helped shape what I want to do in the future."

Enriching Outdoor Experiences for Preschoolers

With the help of the Walk-A-Thon, the Kent City Elementary PTCO, and personal sponsors, the Great Start Readiness Program Preschool team is working to add nature-inspired learning opportunities to the early childhood playground space. Phase one of the playground project was completed over spring break, which includes a dig zone, chalkboard, activity boards, raised garden beds, balancing elements, and most of the landscape edging. Phase two will include adding a few more elements, finishing the edging and PLANTING! In addition, all plant sponsors will have a rock painted by our preschoolers with their family's name and placed in the garden! We are so excited to enrich the outdoor experiences for our smallest Eagles!


